One of our sessions at Staff Training on Tuesday was presented by Stanley Bongwe, author of the book '100 Lessons in DIVERSITY.' The opening chapter of his book quotes lyrics from Rogers and Hammerstein's song "Taught"

> "You've got to be taught to hate and fear You've got to be taught from year to year You've got to be taught before it's too late Before you're six or seven or eight. To hate all the people your relatives hate You've got to be carefully taught."

Stanley Bongwe reinforced the concept that people are never born with hatred, prejudice and fear towards others. These are learned attitudes and behaviours – they are learned from our immediate social circles, especially during our formative years. As parents and teachers we must bear in mind that we have the power to influence young minds. If we can teach hatred and fear and sustain them for generations, it also means we have the capability to teach love, tolerance and respect, as successfully.
