FROM THE HEADMASTER

"I, you, we": these concepts play a major role in creating our approach to community.

In today's world, there is a strong focus on "I". This is communicated in advertisements, in a focus on "my rights" and in the numerous self-help books and programmes that we find in the bookstores. "I," however, is a lonely concept. If I achieve, I do it alone and while I may be proud of this achievement it is based solely on my attributes and effort. Similarly, "I" can be very lonely. There are so many people in the world who feel alone, unloved and not cared for by those around them. Interestingly enough, social media, which by definition should encourage interaction, is sometimes blamed for the "I" factor. Scott Hauptfleisch met with Grade 5 parents on Tuesday to discuss parenting in the age of social media. He will also put a note in our Keyhole next week. Similarly, "you" could be seen as a distancing of myself from what others are doing or feeling. It can work in conjunction with "they" and in today's society seems to be used in a derogatory sense all too often. It also excludes us from the successes of others, thus negating our emotional buy-in to some extent.

"We" on the other hand, brings in feelings of community, of shared griefs and successes and of support. We can find numerous studies and writings on the "power of we" and collaboration is one of our school values.

An interesting exercise is to take note of how often we approach any situation from each of these pronouns. At St Peter's we encourage the boys to concentrate on the "we" factor. We work together, laugh together and win or lose together. Please may I ask the adults in our community to join this "we drive" and to promote Ubuntu both in the boys and ourselves. I believe that it is this sense of community that is one of the most valuable parts of the St Peter's ethos; a strength upon which we can build.

Opportunities for Enrolment in Grades 6 and 7

You will be aware that there have been a number of families who have emigrated over the past few months. Our belief is that this trend will continue and may even escalate. This creates opportunities for boys to get into St Peter's, particularly in the higher grades. We are aware that there is a perception in the marketplace that it is impossible to get into our school because we are oversubscribed. However, it would be good advice to friends who may ask you about placement in St Peter's Prep, that they should apply, particularly in Grades 4-7. Currently we have spaces for new pupils in Grades 6 and 7 and as different families emigrate, other opportunities may open up elsewhere.
