FROM THE HEADMASTER

The end of the Easter Term has arrived. Looking back, two out of the ordinary events have taken place over the past few weeks, and I am pleased to acknowledge the participation of our pupils, staff and parents in our endeavour to build up community and improve our professional delivery.

The first event was the completion of the surveys for our Independent Quality Assurance Agency (IQAA) audit, which is undertaken through the Independent Schools Association of Southern Africa (ISASA). Thank you to the large number of parents, teachers and pupils who completed these surveys. The results have been collated by IQAA and we have had our first interaction between the review team and our school-based project team. This type of survey, which is conducted by an independent and impartial body, is an effective 360 of the whole school and will allow us to celebrate areas in which we are doing well and also identify areas in which there are improvements needed. The feedback we received from all stakeholders is greatly appreciated.

The second community event was far more informal. The Staff Variety Show performances took place on Friday and Saturday evenings over the past two weekends. The Parents' Association took care of all the logistical arrangements including bookings, décor and catering. The team of parents who made up the committee, as well as those volunteers who served food, transformed Dodson Hall into an exciting "Disco" venue and then tidied up after the event, cannot be applauded highly enough. These folk were all volunteers and in addition to working on a number of the evenings, also bought tickets to watch the show, thus adding to the fundraising capacity for the school. Thank you to all parents who supported our SVS through either hard work or simply by attending on a particular evening.

Around 90 staff members and a number of staff spouses from all departments across both schools volunteered to take part in the show. Rehearsals were held over a period of eight weeks prior to the performances without any reduction in normal duties. While one cannot lose sight of the extra hours put into the show, the enjoyment during both rehearsals and shows override the "pain" and the SVS is a wonderful staff bonding experience. Scott Hauptfleisch, who was the producer and director of the SVS needs special mention for his leadership style and dedication, as do the Music Department gurus who spent hours setting lights and sound for the shows.

With a very busy and successful term behind us, I wish everyone in the St Peter's Community a holiday period filled with
