FROM THE HEADMASTER

I recently used a story in Chapel that told how an American pastor had planted a teaspoon full of seeds and harvested the crop, replanting it year after year for a number of years until the crop of wheat was enough to bake over two million loaves of bread. This idea of constantly building on our resources as well as having the patience to wait for the final crop has much to teach us about primary school education.

Each phase in the preparatory school can be likened to a crop, with the exponential growth over time being the ultimate goal rather than immediate gratification. Learning to read and write is a basic foundation for further academic success, learning to hum a tune or play the recorder is the first step towards composing one's own music and learning how to bounce and catch a ball could be in preparation for the NBA or IPL. Each year builds on existing skills and expands or reinforces them in what educationalists call a spiral curriculum.

What we all need to remember, however, is that the first crop no matter how small, is just as significant as the final product. There will also be trials and tribulations, which could be likened to times of drought or pestilence along the way. What we need to do is to keep the end in mind and to see each day as a chance for our boys to grow, not only in ability but also in character. The end product from a preparatory school should be a boy with a sound academic, sporting and cultural foundation, who has the confidence, humility and grit to make best use of everything that a high school has to offer and into later life. We have two lessons to learn from the American pastor; firstly, the final product does not happen overnight and, secondly, that every crop, no matter how small, is a significant step towards creating a well-rounded and confident St Peter's boy.
