FROM THE JUNIOR PREP

PLAY!

I attended a workshop this week hosted by the Lego Foundation entitled "What we mean by: Learning through Play." We need to realise the world of tomorrow is going to be one of many challenges, but also of tremendous opportunity. People will require continuous re-skilling and a need for lifelong learning. Through play our children learn the ability to find solutions, to come up with ideas and to imagine alternatives, as they connect with others and their surroundings in a positive way. Learning through play is crucial for a child's positive development.

From a young age (infancy), children have the ability to learn about the world through play. These natural-born skills enable children to become engaged, lifelong learners; if the skills are nurtured and supported. Play activities could be free play, guided play or games with a learning goal. Play needs to have a holistic approach as it allows a child to develop physical, social, emotional, cognitive and creative skills. Knowing how to read, write and do maths is important for children to take part in the world; but this holistic approach recognises broader skill sets that underpin learning for life. I would like to end with a quote from Seymour Papert "Rather than pushing children to think like adults, we might do better to remember that they are great learners and to try harder to be more like them."
