FROM THE HEADMASTER

I wonder if you have seen the recent footage on a pilot whale that died as a result of ingesting hundreds of plastic bags? While the footage is somewhat distressing, the occurrence is far from uncommon. In addition, ongoing talks about climate change and how nations can work towards alleviating the problem, have been somewhat hamstrung by a decision by one of the world's superpowers to "go their own way." While we have been given a beautiful world to live in, we have also been assigned the responsibility of stewardship for our environment. The two events mentioned above are comparable in that convenience and wealth creation have been judged to be of more importance than stewardship. I cannot help but wonder whether this belief, that in today's world, what matters "within my bubble" is far more pressing than global or societal issues. Certainly, the IBSC Conference identified that this "me" factor is a dangerous addition to modern living and that the need to accentuate the "we" factor in schools is essential if we are to prepare boys for the future.

I am pleased to share a new St Peter's initiative with you that talks to our attempt to address this need on a "home" front. The following communication was forwarded by our Operations Department this week:

We are delighted to advise that Bekabee (recycling and waste disposal company) have started their services at St Peter's. Bekabee offer a full waste recycling system for all waste generated at the school reducing the amount of waste that goes to landfill.

How it works:

The Grounds team collect all the refuse bins from the school grounds and take them to the recycling stations at the current Skip area where the Bekabee team separate recyclables from non-recyclables and remove all from site. The process is monitored and run by a Bekabee employee who is based on site full time.



I have encouraged the boys to play a real part in the project as eco-warriors and would like to ask parents and the broader community to help us by encouraging, correcting and role-modelling the collection of waste and in the placement into the appropriate bins around the school.

I commend the Operations department and Enviro committee for this fine initiative. The programme will be calibrated over the next few months to get it working optimally and we hope to be able to report on its progress once it is fully operational.
