# **CELEBRATING OUR ENVIRONMENT**

Next week, Wednesday, 05 June is World Environment Day and all Junior Prep boys will be learning about how they can take responsibility for our world.

On Monday morning during Prayers, Lee-Ann Pickering will be discussing the impact man has on our environment. The boys will be taught how to make an Ecobrick using a 2ℓ bottle (see below for instructions). They will be given the challenge of making an Ecobrick as a class, as well as at home. This challenge will continue until the end of term.

Later in the day the boys will be attending a puppet show entitled "Our World, Our Responsibility" from which they will learn you are never too young to look after our beautiful world and will be given some ideas on the difference they can

Wednesday's classes will take place outdoors, using nature as our teaching tools. Boys will also be exposed to the world of owls and the important role these birds play in our Eco-System. Over time our boys will discover for themselves the impact owls have on ecology.

I have no doubt our boys are going to enjoy the week ahead and come home with many new ideas and an awareness of our environment.

# **ECOBRICKS**

Ecobricks are plastic bottles, packed with non-recyclable plastic to a set density to create a reusable building block. Ecobricks are used to make modular furniture, garden spaces and full-scale buildings such as schools and houses. An Ecobrick is made of a plastic bottle which has non-recyclable plastic waste compressed inside it. Generally, a stick is used to stuff the rinsed and dried bottle densely, layer by layer, with non-biodegradable waste.

Each class will be making an Ecobrick. For the duration of the term, they will be collecting plastic waste from their lunch boxes to help build their class Ecobricks after each break. The boys will also be encouraged to make Ecobricks at home and bring the completed bricks to school, where their name will be entered into a lucky draw. Please note that the Ecobrick is considered full, when it weighs between 400-600g.

Some items that could go into an Ecobrick: cling wrap, straws, chip packets, yoghurt tub lids, cellophane etc.

We are very excited by this project and hope that you will encourage and assist your son with completing an Ecobrick.

#### **CHAPEL COLLECTION**

The Chapel collection for the first term has gone to an organisation called the Door of Hope. This is a faith-based ministry established in 1999 and is a home for abandoned and unwanted babies. This organisation has a 'baby box' built into a church wall, where mothers can safely place their babies, if they are unable to keep them. The Door of Hope are also sent babies from the police, hospitals and Child protection agencies. Since it started, the Door of Hope have saved close to 1700 babies. The babies are able to stay there until they are adopted, reunited or placed into long term foster care.

In 1992, Frank was homeless, broke, unemployed and separated from his family, trying to get a job and earn a living in Johannesburg coming from Port Elizabeth. His is a remarkable story of how, through the social activism, in particular two women who supported him, he was able to live up to his personal goals and vision.

His first breakthrough was selling fruit and vegetables in downtown Johannesburg, Frank "beat the odds" and "escaped" homelessness. Then he embarked on studying (BSc, BSc Hons and MSc degrees) and this paved the way for his illustrious corporate career in the financial services sector in SA that included various Executive positions. One of his greatest highlights was in 2013 attending and completing the Advanced Management Programme at Harvard Business School. Today he is recognised as an entrepreneur, financial wellness expert, philanthropist and business speaker. He is also reading for his doctorate in financial planning at Kansas State University.

Frank's story is about overcoming obstacles, the power of choices, and the power of purpose in life.
