FROM THE HEADMASTER

Yesterday was Ash Wednesday. This day marks the beginning of Lent in the Anglican Church Year. Lent lasts for 46 days in the lead up to Easter Day, when we celebrate the rising of Jesus Christ from the tomb after His crucifixion. During Lent we typically try to give up something we enjoy doing and/or take up a practice that will help us to reflect on our Christian life. Sundays during Lent are regarded as "mini-Easters" and we are free from these undertakings on these days. Thus, the actual number of Lenten days is 40. Father Richard's sermon yesterday reflected on the similarity of the ashes after a fynbos fire, which is essential for some of the plant seeds to germinate and begin new life, and the Lenten ashes.
