FROM THE HEADMASTER

The rain, while very welcome, has been playing havoc with sports practices and fixtures since the term began and I know that there have been a number of boys who expressed disappointment at missing their first match. The good news is that we have a number of weeks ahead and I am hopeful that a full term of healthy competition awaits. Competition is an important part of being a boy. As they mature, we find boys competing both formally and informally in many different spheres. This is healthy and is to be encouraged; however the manner in which one competes is an important part of the intentional character education that we are focussing on this year.

Part of St Peter's grooming is that we respect our opponents' efforts and applaud their success. Thus, if a boy scores 50 runs in a cricket match, it is appropriate to congratulate him even if he is your opponent. Similarly, while basketball can be a sport in which there is often contact between players resulting in collisions and falling to the ground, it is important that one extends a hand to the opposing player to help him up or to shake hands to acknowledge that this is a game, which is played for our development and fun. Referees and umpires have the role of controlling the game impartially to the best of their ability. While the intention to be unbiased and "all-seeing" is always there, they may view a particular play or LBW decision differently to some of the players or parents. As members of the St Peter's community, we do not express disagreement or disappointment by shouting either advice or abuse. All referees and umpires are treated with respect as we acknowledge that they are serving the game. As we begin a wonderful year of competition in sport, we will also use the opportunity as another arena for our conscious development of character. My request to parents is that you assist us in our endeavours by not only modelling the correct behavior, but also reminding the boys about our expectations if you see the need or opportunity within the competitive environment.

The academic programme is overseen by Catherine Steenhoff and her team of HOD's (Heads of Department) and Grade Heads. This team is the focus of our "meet the staff" feature this week.
