FROM THE HEADMASTER

We were enthralled by the choir performances last week and are in line for more cultural 'wow' moments in the weeks to come. The School Production, 'The Prince of Egypt', will be performed on Thursday and Friday evening, with 'Viva Voce' following within the next two weeks. We are blessed to have such talented boys and I applaud our Music and Drama department for the outstanding motivation and guidance they give the pupils. Remember that our online booking system will be used for these events so watch out for the notifications.

You received your son's 1st Semester report just before mid-term and will notice that our second round of pupil-led conferences are due to take place at the end of July. It is important to distinguish between the two sessions of reporting in terms of their role in the education process.

Pupil-led conferences are part of what is termed formative assessment. The philosophy behind these conferences is that that boys take greater responsibility for their own learning by leading sessions which include the other two 'legs' of our three-legged educational pot, namely the parent and the teacher.

Daniel Pink (https://www.brainpickings.org/2013/05/09/daniel-pink-drive-rsa-motivation/) emphasises the importance of learning that includes autonomy, mastery and self-direction. The aim of the pupil-led conferences is to create learning that is self-directed and self-assessed. At the end of the first term, your sons led meetings in which they identified areas of their learning that they felt were going well and upon which they could build, as well as areas in which they had concerns. In consultation with their parents and teachers, they should have put strategies in place and undertaken to commit themselves to their own educational development. Your conferences at the end of this term are designed to revisit these educational plans, assess their success thus far and to calibrate any interventions accordingly. In addition, certain goals may have been met and can be acknowledged, and new goals may be formulated. The focus of these meetings should be on actions and responsibility, thus empowering the child to take greater responsibility for his development.

The above is in contrast to the 1st semester report that you received which provides feedback regarding your son's progress so far this year. While this information is used to inform everyone as to the success of the learning programme, it is not built upon further. Thus, it is seen as a summative evaluation. The second report of this nature is the end of year report, which will include all continuous assessment as well as final test or exam marks where appropriate. These reports are the ones that are forwarded to the various high schools when your son applies to them at the beginning of Grade 7. Should you wish to discuss any aspect of this report directly with the teachers, please feel free to make an appointment and spend time with them.

I hope that this distinction will help to set the tone for the upcoming pupil-led conferences. These are extremely important learning tools and I would ask that you follow up with 'check-in' discussions regularly during the term. Please attend the pupil-led conferences with the idea of being a vital cog in your son's development towards autonomy, mastery and self-direction.



MAIL DELIVERY - HELP

At St Peter's Prep, we send out bulk emails when distributing various communications including the weekly newsletter. These bulk mails are recognised, by definition, as Spam/Junk Email. These then accumulate in the Junk Email folder on your computer.

In order to remedy this problem, please follow the advice below (given by the St Peter's IT Department): Go into the 'Junk Email' folder, open the email message (refer to image below). Click on the downward arrow on Junk and then choose 'Never Block Sender's Domain'.



If however, you do not have any of St Peter's emails in the junk email or inbox, WHITE LISTING is required.

PLEASE NOTE that we have received confirmation from a few parents that WHITE LISTING stpeters.joburg with their service providers/network administrators has resolved the issue with bulk email not being delivered.


