CLAY OVEN FIRE ASSISTANCE

As many of you will know, a large fire occurred on Friday night at the Clay Oven informal settlement across the road from the school. 128 shacks were completely destroyed. This affects approx 250 people, including 50 women and 20 young children.

TOILETRIES:

- Soap

KITCHENWARE:

- Cooking pots
- Cooking utensils

UNDERWEAR for ladies and small children (up to age 6).

Collection points are in place at the lower car park and chapel and both JP Girls receptions and JP Boys reception. These are urgent needs, so we will deliver what is collected every day, and will be collecting up until Tuesday next week.
