There have been articles written that argue that boys under 12 years of age are not emotionally and physically ready for competitive sport due to the fact that they are not mature enough or have not developed the emotional intelligence to deal with failure. There are also arguments that there should be more of a focus on the development of skills in a safe environment that is optimal for development.

On the other hand, 'boys best practice' shows that boys thrive and are motivated by 'healthy' competition. This is certainly evident in the classroom, which in school and thereafter, extends to the sports field.

So, what is the best approach to take when there are contradictions? This is where perspective is vitally important. We, as adults, can often lose sight of the fact that a match between two teams of young boys is more than just a competition. It is an opportunity for growth, expression and fun. It is an opportunity to develop the fine art of sportsmanship, of how to win and lose graciously and in a humble manner. It is an opportunity to learn strategy and problem solving, to make critical decisions under pressure, to develop resilience and perseverance, to learn how to work collaboratively as a team and to understand roles and execute skills. Lastly and most importantly it is an opportunity to make friends from circles with which they do not normally get to interact.

It is our role as educators and parents to make sure that the boys understand that opportunities like this are more important than the team in which they are playing. It is our duty to make sure the environment we create is a safe and developmentally optimal one for the boys to express themselves without the fear of failure. It is our duty to make sure that we use sport to educate them and to use the sports field as an extension of the classroom.

Luke Van Ryswyk was selected for the 1st Rugby 7s Team and awarded Half Colours for Rugby 7s.


