#### **Student Affairs News**

#### **Grade 8 Orientation**

The grade 8 year began with an orientation programme designed to allow the grade 8's an opportunity to integrate into College life. They were exposed to an array of activities ranging from sports, to culture and fun activities such as treasure hunts. The grade 8's reported that they had enjoyed the activities and have transitioned into high school with confidence. The prefect body was used to oversee the programme.

#### **Camps**

From 24<sup>th</sup> of January to the 26<sup>th</sup> of January Grade 8,9 and 11's went away on grade camps. Grade 8's went to Klein Kariba for their orientation camp, the Grade 9's went to Mountain Sanctuary Park and the focus of the camp was preparation for the Grade 10 camp. The grade 9's focus on hard and soft skills that will be needed the following year. The Grade 11's went to Camp Discovery, a camp that has activities that look at leadership identification and development. The Grade 12's remained at school and went through leadership and mentorship programmes. As the seniors of the school it is important that every grade 12 is given the opportunity to enhance their leadership skills. They also need to undergo a workshop on mentorship to better prepare them for the mentorship programme.

#### **Mentorship Programme**

The grade 8 students were assigned to grade 12 students to mentor and buddy them through term 1 and term 2. An introductory coffee and muffin morning was held to ensure that the first official meeting between the grade 8's and 12's went off smoothly. Since the introduction the grade 12's and grade 8's has participated in a treasure hunt together and the grade 8's was part of the handing out of matric dance invitations.

#### **College Build Project**

Last year students assisted Kwasa College by building a school hall. The building is almost complete and is at the roof stage. Final payments are being made for the hall.

The student build committee has been finalized and students have launched the build projects with the school. The decision was taken to build houses with Habitat for Humanity as we believe that we have exhausted our donations to Kwasa College and will review this in a years' time. Each house will take around R100 000 to build and building will take place in Orange Farm. Habitat for Humanity provide all support and tools needed for the build. We are hoping for another successful year of raising funds for a good cause.
