Message from the Headmaster

Dear Parents, Students and Staff,

You would have received the following email from our Deputy Headmistress of Student Affairs, Mrs Odelle Howard notifying you of our intention to start random drug testing our students:

"St Peter's College is a drug free school and we are concerned with the scourge of drug abuse that is facing our society. As a result, we have decided to run random drug tests to protect our children and to look after their well-being. Our policy is not punitive but one of rehabilitation. For more information please read the Substance Abuse Policy that is found on the College website under Student Affairs. Should you object to having your child tested, please ensure that you forward your objections in writing to the Headmaster, Mr Morais, by Wednesday, 22 March 2017".

I would like to bring to your attention our Substance Abuse and Prevention Policy which you will find on the St Peter's College website under the following link:

I want to highlight some of the important points in our Substance Abuse and Prevention Policy:

- 1.5. The purpose of this policy is two-fold:
- 1.5.1. to protect and assist any individual Student by outlining the approach taken by the College to rehabilitation and counselling.
- 4. Rehabilitation and Counselling
- 4.1. It is policy not to condemn Students but to support those who need help. Where possible, this will be managed in a way that least impacts on the Student's school career.
- 4.2. Students who voluntarily request help and/or those referred by Parents or teachers will be sent to the school counsellor. The approach will be one that is nonjudgmental and non-disciplinary. The school counsellor will provide assistance in recommending the best possible course of rehabilitation. An appropriate agreement for rehabilitation will be drafted by the College, and signed by the Student, the Parent/Legal Guardian, the Head and the counsellor. The confidentiality of the Student and the family is paramount throughout this process.

Why do some schools conduct random drug tests?

A recent article by the National Institute on Drug Abuse highlighted the fact that random student drug testing seeks to decrease drug use amongst students via two routes:

- 1. They hope random testing will serve as a deterrent and give students a reason to resist peer pressure to take drugs.
- 2. Drug testing can identify teens who have started using drugs and would be good targets for early intervention, as well as identify those who already have drug problems, so they can be referred for treatment. Using drugs not only interferes with a student's ability to learn, but it can also disrupt the teaching environment, affecting other students as well.



- What is the URL?
- Is the extension appropriate to the content?
- Who is the author?
- Is there contact information for the author?
- What are the author's credentials?
- Does the site appear to be professional?
- Are there typos and other errors?
- What is the purpose of the site?
