A group of senior art students attended four galleries in Rosebank in January. The Circa Gallery, Everard Reed Gallery, the



Goodman Gallery, and Lizamore and Associates. Showing at Circa was ANDRZEJ URBANSKI's exhibition titled, A03 2034/538/18, showing contemporary abstract work, and JAN K. COETZEE's exhibition about his past growing up in a religious, colonialist and racist country. Coetzee's work is displayed in Perspex boxes containing old books and religious iconography.

GERARD MARX's show at the Goodman Gallery was made up of his new works based on his ongoing series of disorientating maps, which is investigated through the words of writer Alexandra Dodd.

Marx cut up old maps and used the pieces to create his own reality. He created spirals and geometric shapes by reorganising the pieces of map.

At Lizamore and Associates, FRANK VAN REENAN's exhibition showed sculptures that he made as a psychological escape and it depicts political issues in a humorous way. It is a tongue-in-cheek look at social ideologies, hopes and dreams.

Equestrian

Every show has its ups and downs when you're dealing with unpredictable horses. Most people have a set view about



horse-riding, and that is the horse does all the work. While that is true to some degree, having five minutes between Dressage and Showing classes to change your riding gear is a real work-out. Especially when your Showing class is on the other side of the world in relation to your Dressage class.

Now if you think that having back-to-back meetings all day is a hassle, imagine having those meetings with each one requiring a different outfit, different presentations, and in some cases, a different boss! That is what it feels like during a show when you have a different outfit, different tests to ride, or courses to jump, or

different horses to ride, all of which must be swapped and changed at lightning speed before you're back on and warming up.

People often don't realise how much the rider does in this team, because if your horse does not want to box and go to the show on the day, you go without them and find whoever you can find to ride, even if you're getting on that horse for the first time ever - just 10min before your class. Behind all the fancy looks, and pretty horses, one of the best characteristics of any horse-rider pair is adaptability.

Anything can happen at any time. Nothing is guaranteed when you're working with a horse who has their own mind, so you must be prepared for anything.

That is something our riders coped extremely well with over the weekend, with clashing classes, stubborn horses and a few surprises, they still achieved their best and adapted to any situation thrown their way.

The A team faced Crawford Sandton A and managed to come off with another valuable win, sending them into the final round undefeated.




