- A recognised Degree with at least Level 2 Mathematics with Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) or Bachelors of Education majoring in Mathematics at senior level.
- Relevant experience of IEB curriculum objectives and assessment from Gr 8 to Gr 12.
- Proven record of teaching excellence and use of effective, innovative teaching strategies including the use of technology within the classroom.
- Must demonstrate commitment to life—long learning and to personal professional development.
- Ability to teach Advanced Programme Mathematics would be an advantage.
- Proof of registration with SACE.
- Ability to work as part of a dynamic team and commitment to high academic standards within the department.

- having an understanding of and passion for enquiry based, student-centred learning;
- leading a classroom first by example of conduct and then by instructing learners through teaching excellence;
- using technology for instruction;
- communicating with parents through e-mail, telephone and parent-teacher conferences on a regular basis;
- willing to fully participate in opportunities for professional growth;
- commitment and participation in at least one co-curricular activity per term; and
