Grade 7 parents will notice the optional netball trials taking place next week – this is a once off occurrence as we need to select the A team for the upcoming tour.


As we are all aware, the water crisis in Cape Town has had a huge impact on the whole country. It has also, unfortunately, affected our planned tennis and netball tour to Wynberg Girls in March. The good news, however, is that Collegiate in Port Elizabeth has offered to host the festival from 23-25 March, so this means our A team tennis girls and Grade 7A netball team will still be touring, albeit to a different destination! More information will be distributed to the relevant girls and parents as it becomes available.

We have also been experiencing extreme weather in Johannesburg recently, with temperatures well over 30 degrees. Please can I appeal to all parents to ensure that their daughter comes to school with a full water bottle, a sunhat and with sunscreen applied every day. The water bottles can be refilled as needed (especially before sport) and the sunscreen should also be re-applied before sports lessons. Our coaches have been briefed as to how to handle the heat (especially on the tennis courts) and should the weather reach a high discomfort level, we will make a call to cancel sport.

We are excited to announce the launch of our first competitive robotics club. All girls will be learning about coding and robotics as part of our new extended EdTech curriculum. The robotics club is a great opportunity for girls who feel passionate about this field to expand their knowledge and skills.

We will be using the Lego Mindstorm EV3s and joining the national league.

The club will run on a Thursday from 14:00-14:45 and 14:45-15:30 (girls can attend both sessions if they want to!). The club is open to Grade 6 & 7 girls. Spaces are limited so we may need to introduce an application process, depending on the number of girls who are interested.

Joining the club is a yearlong commitment and girls are expected to attend the session every week. Girls will also need to make themselves available for competitions - we hope to compete locally, nationally and even possibly internationally.
