FROM THE RECTOR

St Peter's Intern Programme: We now have 25 interns on campus ranging from first to fourth year in their studies. Their ability to achieve excellent exam results, while managing family responsibilities, e.g. cooking, and caring for younger siblings, is inspirational. The children continue to delight in their presence and frequently form strong bonds with them. Their role in the classroom has resulted in improved Reading and Mathematics ages, thanks to the increased student-teacher contact time.

Over and above this, the programme is able to change the lives, albeit of a very small number of people. In its own small way, it also addresses South Africa's most pressing issue, that of the lack of quality education.

We are deeply grateful to those parents who have, and continue to support this programme financially, or with their time. We are especially grateful to the CIDA Empowerment Trust (www.cidatrust.org) which supports 6 interns and the Gauteng Central Region Academy (GCRA) (www.gauteng.gov.za\services\youth\Pages\GCRA.aspx, which supports 16.

CIDA seeks to multiply the positive effects of quality in education in low income communities. It focuses on teacher development in the highly successful internship model that St Peter's offers.

The GCRA is a branch of the Gauteng Department of Education responsible for promoting skills development. It also seeks to enable young people to make the transition from school to work through relevant work training opportunities. It, too, has recognised the success of the St Peter's Intern Programme, in partnership with the University of Johannesburg, and also sponsored interns in 2017.

FROM THE DEPUTY HEAD: ACADEMICS

The new report provides feedback on the three main areas of focus at Peter's, which were addressed at the parents' information evenings at the beginning of the year, namely: character development, skills for life and core academic skills. *Character development* embraces our values-based foundation explicit in our teaching: responsibility, collaboration, compassion, respect and honour. *Skills-for-Life* includes descriptions of activities designed to promote development in the key areas: Music, Art, Physical Education, EdTech, Life Orientation and Drama. The *core academic skills* are English, First Additional Languages, Mathematics, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and Exploration and Learning - a composite subject, which encompasses the varied skills of Social Sciences and includes relevant and current content matter. The reports will be issued to your daughters today, Thursday, 21 June.

Many comments on the reports, written by the staff, refer to the development of a growth mindset. Carol Dweck, a renowned psychologist, identified this critical component to succeeding in all aspects of life. A growth mindset is a common factor associated with all high achievers.

Growth mindset is a subtle, but important change to pedagogy. Assessment and classroom language has far-reaching effects on student outcomes. A focus on the development of this encourages feedback practices, which inspires students to seek challenges, focus on learning, exert their full effort and be resilient problem-solvers when they encounter difficulty.

St Peter's provides students with a 'safe space' for trying something new, without being assessed. We praise and reward personal growth in the classroom. Our girls know that learning and growth are valued for their own sake. In the classroom, we aim to provide specific actionable feedback about performance, which is motivating and empowering so that the pupil understands the steps involved in reaching the target. Our goal is to further develop the process to focus more on what our girls do i.e. the things over which they have control - rather than their intelligence alone. This helps them focus on their own learning processes, rather than how they compare to others.

Student-led Conferences are scheduled for the week starting the 23 July. Parent consultations with academic staff who are involved in teaching the specialist subjects, are on offer for those parents who require greater feedback, on Tuesday, 31 July.

ROBOTICS MORNING

Our girls took part in their first internal robotics competition on Saturday morning. The team players required grit and determination, in order to programme the Mindstorm EV3s to complete an obstacle course and solve various challenges.
