# ST PETER'S GIRLS PREP SCHOOL

### FROM THE DEPUTY HEAD: ACADEMICS

At the Kingsmead Book Fare last weekend, Emma Sadlier and Nicky Bush debated the issues around social media and the challenges involved for our children. They have both visited St Peter's in the past and will be invited to address our girls again. A brief summary is included below as a reminder of the online world our girls negotiate each day.

Both presenters mentioned that they have contracts on their websites for parents' use when a cellphone is given to their children. It isn't as much around the signing of the contract and the understanding of the consequences, but also the importance of the conversation on acceptable social media behaviour. Nicky mentioned that the parents 'own' the cellphone and that there should be conditions under which the phone can be used.

- Our girls need to learn how to self-protect on the internet. 'Nice' kids can still be tricked online because they don't think through their actions. We need to encourage them to take their value system into the online world and avoid taking risks because of anonymity.
- If something is free then they are the product. The saying applies, 'If it feels too good to be true, it usually is.'
- There needs to be an understanding of the choices to be made when parents aren't around. Conversations should include scenarios. What to do if . . . happens? Share stories to make your girls alert. There is frequently no going back after cyber bullying. Make girls aware of their online reputation. Some children have had to change their names to escape their 'new reputation' as the internet 'never forgets'.
- Screen shots are out of their control once they have been posted. The platform is immediate and international.

Both presenters suggested that the girls shouldn't have smart phones before the age of 13 and mentioned that the average age of children seeing porn on their cellphones in South Africa is 11 years old. 'Sexting' under the age of 16 is illegal.

• Comments on posts suggest consensus. Receiving pictures can also be seen as consensual. Not everyone on a WhatsApp group is a friend.

Then, there was advice on the management of phones:

- Don't sleep with cellphones next to the bed. There is a major addiction problem and we all feel that there is a need to respond to messages immediately.
- The blue light of the phone may influence sleep patterns. More and more children are arriving at school tired.
- We need to create 'device free' areas in our homes perhaps the dinner table?

Nicky Bush has written *Tech Savvy* and Emma Sadlier has just published *Selfies, Sexts and Smartphones*. They suggest that these books can be read by children from the age of 11.
