Creative expression in a judgement-free classroom environment, which invites joy. It builds confidence, positive self-esteem and ensures that learning comes alive. Socially it helps us to learn more about ourselves and each other. Drama plays an important role in educating the whole person. It caters for different styles of learning and supports the importance of emotional development. In his ground-breaking book Emotional Intelligence (1985), psychologist Daniel Goleman suggests that one's EQ (Emotional Quotient) is a greater predictor of success and fulfilment in life than our IQ (Intelligence Quotient).

The drama programme works at developing self-awareness, ability to manage emotions, empathy toward others, improved interaction with others and growing self-motivation. Activities include creative play, improvisations, miming, role-playing, choral speaking, poetry presentations, movement and rhythms and dramatisation of stories. We are looking forward to the Grade 7 production of *Treasure Island* towards the end of the Trinity Term.
