From Father Richard:

The countdown to Shrove Tuesday, or pancake Tuesday as most of us know it, has ended and this signals the beginning of the journey towards Easter. I'm still recovering from Christmas and trying to implement all those New Year's resolutions I decided on. I'm not ready for Easter, but I have to be because time zooms on.

Often our Christian journey mirrors the same sentiments. We really do want to be better Christians, go to church more often and yes, we do strive to be better people, but time just runs away with us and we are left with only good intentions!

This time, before Easter is exactly that. It is about us deciding on one attribute, which we want to change, regarding our relationship with God, and taking the next 40 to make that change. WAITING CLASS

Waiting Class has been designed to assist parents who have daughters in the JP and SP and for those parents who have difficulties with traffic and other unexpected crises. It has come to our attention that at times there is confusion about Waiting Class procedures. In order to make sure that the girls are safe, we have the following strategies in place:

- **Grade 0** wait in their classroom until 13:15 every day. They are then brought up to the Waiting Class area.
- Grade 1 stays in class until 13:25. They then move to the Waiting area by 13:30
- Grade 2 is taken to Waiting Class at 13:45 on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday.
- **Choir** girls, not collected at 14:30, can be collected at the Afterschool Programme.
- On a Wednesday and Friday, Grade 2 girls will go to Waiting Class at 13:15.
- Extra Murals start at 13:15.
- All girls who are not collected by 14:00, can be collected at the Afterschool Programme.
- Girls may only go home with a friend, if they have permission and a note to the teacher.

We hope this helps with clarification.

BOOK WEEK

The St Peter's JP Girls will be celebrating Book Week during the week of 26 February - 2 March 2018. Book Week is about celebrating reading, writing, authors and their work. We are excited to be celebrating Book Week, this year, with a South African author from Durban, Dianne Stewart.

Our theme this year is 'Dianne Stewart Explored!'

An Award winning author, Dianne Stewart, has published several books, some internationally. She has a B.A. (Hons) degree in African Languages, a M.A. degree in South African Literature and a M.A. in Creative Writing. In January 2018, she held a workshop on 'Memoir Writing' at the University of Cape Town Summer School.

Activities that will take place during the book week are:

Hooked on Books:

The Hooked on Books show is dramatised book-trailers from 11 pre-selected contemporary children's books, which change on a yearly basis. It will take place on the 23 February in the Royce Hall, the Friday before Book Week. A charge of R17 will be charged on each girl's sundries accounts for HOB show.

Author of study:

Dianne Stewart is the author of study for all of the grades this year. Each grade level will select a book written by her and do activities in their classroom. Dianne will be at the Girls School on Monday, 26 February and we will be selling her books that day. She will be autographing the books from 12:30. You can also buy your own copy from a bookshop and bring it in to be autographed. There will be a charge of R20 for the author visit.

DEAR Time:

'Drop everything and Read' is an activity that happens in the classroom during a set time. It is about making time to read, where everyone drops everything that they are doing and reads for 10 minutes.

Dress-up day:

Dress-up day will take place on Thursday, 28 February. The theme is *My favourite book character or author*.

Book Sale:

The **Travelling Bookshop** will host a book sale from Monday, 26 – Wednesday, 28 of February. The book sale will take place at the Newlands Pavilion. Book prices range from R70 upwards. Please send your child with an amount of R100 or more. Alternatively, you can take your daughter to purchase a book after school during this time.

We will celebrate all the learning together with a presentation of the activities that took place in classrooms on Thursday, 2 March - to declare the end of Book Week 2018.

- Personalise from which school you wish to receive notifications and tick at least one of the following; Girls Junior Prep General, Girl Senior Prep General, Boys Junior Prep General, Boys Senior Prep General, or College
