

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# THROUGH THE KEYHOLE

#### **GIRLS SCHOOL**

A few weeks back the school's Exco attended a course at Gibbs Business School on Design Thinking. This process provides us with a roadmap to solve life's challenges and promotes innovation.



We looked at numerous case studies of businesses who have used this process to stay relevant in the world of tomorrow. For me, the most interesting part of this process is the need for companies to prototype solutions to their challenges. One example they used was BMW. They are in the process of prototyping driverless cars that could be ordered on demand to drive a person from A to B. That would essentially change their core business of building and selling cars to individuals but would keep them relevant in the world of tomorrow.

One business that has not used this process to evolve - is schooling.

But thankfully St Peter's is no ordinary school.

As much as we could use this process far more – I am delighted that we do prototype initiatives to not only model this process for our girls to use in the real world but also to ensure we are offering a relevant world-class education. This year we have prototyped various initiatives. In the classroom we have implemented strategies to enhance the concept of personalized learning and we have trialed numerous inquiry based projects.

On the sports field, a further example of prototyping was our new-look Inter-house Athletics Meeting held last Saturday. We experimented with starting the event with mass participation races for every grade and then went into the usual track races.

Constructive feedback is key to the success of the Design Thinking process. Hence, as we start the last five weeks of the year parents, staff and our girls are encouraged to reflect on the year and use every opportunity to provide this valuable feedback. The girls will be asked to do "stop, start, continue" reflections for their teachers. Teachers have been asked to do something similar for their respective line managers and parents are invited, as always, to share their thoughts about the year, with their daughter's class teacher or respective Head of Phase. We can then use this feedback to reflect and redesign our educational strategies and prototypes for 2019.

The outcome of this reflection process and plans for 2019 will be revealed at next year's Information Evenings. What an exciting place to teach and learn!


## **DIVERSITY - DIWALI**
