FROM THE HEADMASTER

Welcome back to another exciting term at St Peter's. Our Trinity Term promises to keep us all extremely busy, as always!

The holidays always present opportunities for reading and discussion about matters educational. One such conversation of late was about the disconnect between the skills needed in the world of work (problem solving, critical thinking, creativity, people management, collaboration, EQ, judgement and decision making, service and cognitive flexibility) and the process of 'doing' school. Which, if you think about it, is somewhat bizarre in the context of school needing to prepare children for life.

In the context of this conversation we, over the years, have implemented a number of changes to our school curriculum. One of these changes has been acquiring an understanding that what we do at St Peter's is actually divided into three interrelated areas:

CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT:

Being an Anglican school, the church is always at the centre of everything we do. We have chosen: *Respect, Resilience, Responsibility, Compassion, Collaboration,* and being *Honourable,* to teach as deliberate Christian Values. The teaching of Life Orientation, Religious Education and Leadership falls in this area, as well as the ongoing Pastoral Care that is provided on a daily basis.

CORE SKILLS:

These are the essential school subjects: Maths, English, Second Languages, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and Social Sciences through Inquiry Based Learning.

LIFE SKILLS:

Music, Drama, Art, Chess, Sport and Physical Education, Coding, IT, Entrepreneurial skills and Public Speaking are all critical skills for life.

Going forward, our school reports will be divided into these three elements.

Our current initiative, as discussed at our Parent Information Evenings, is to implement Personalised Learning to a far greater extent. Further information on Personalised Learning will be sent to you in an upcoming newsletter.
